CSI NEWSLETTER

DATA PRICE CHANGE

A semi-annual review of our pricing policy determined that some of CSI's data prices require adjustment. All base rates for accessing the CSI service via long distance remain unchanged and, in fact, the late access discount of 10% will now be effective at 8:00 P.M. E.S.T. instead of 9:00 P.M. E.S.T. Historical data for "normal" contracts will stay about the same also but will be priced in a less complex manner. Price categories that will increase, however, effective June 1, 1983 include the Telenet/Tymnet/Uninet costs, early access rates, and the cost for Perpetual contract history data.

The high costs of Telenet, Tymnet, and Uninet prompted the costing investigation because revenue from users does not cover the CSI absorbed costs of these services. The increase in these rates as shown by the new enclosed price list is only moderate, but could influence users to change their method of access.

Another category that affects CSI costs is the purchase of the popular CSI Perpetual Contracts. A user retrieving a perpetual contract demands ten times as much computer resources as a user collecting a regular specific, generic, or nearest future contract. We are, therefore, increasing slightly the cost for perpetual history data.

Daily users of perpetual data are not affected and their costs will remain the same except as noted above.

The CSI Perpetual Contract (t.m.) is rapidly becoming an industry norm for driving analysis software. Stanley Kroll and Wells Wilder use it as the sole basis for data inputs for their system introduced in upcoming seminars during May of 1983. Their results were enhanced through its use.

CSI is offering a special price to purchasers of historical data on the CSI Perpetual Contract during the month of May 1983, only. You can use the data to check out the Kroll-Wilder system, the new Quickstudy analysis routines on the Quicktrieve disc, or any analysis programs that are self-written.

Quicktrieve News:

Customers have noted that occasionally during the printing of the distribution report with Quicktrieve, the previous close shows up as zero. This event usually occurs when the distribution status column displays: "NODT" meaning that data for the day before date was not

filed because the date did not exist on the output diskette. What happens a file type of 'S' will usually be present. If so, identified an ending date prior to the delivery date. To correct please recreate the file and move the old file onto the new.

Version 2.2 Quicktrieve Manual Mailing:

All manuals have been mailed to customers who have ordered the Version 2.2 Quicktrieve. They were mailed 3rd class so if you have not received yours, please wait a day or two before calling us.

Version 2.1 Users

If you are using Quicktrieve Version 2.1 and would like to receive version 2.2 which holds the improved Quickstudy and Quickplot programs, then please include \$20.00 additional with your enclosed invoice.

Quicktrieve Version 2.2 Hangs at the Copyright Notice:

Accoustical coupler users who interface through the Apple Super Serial Card may experience Quicktrieve hanging after the Copyright label is displayed. The accoustical coupler supplies voltage through lead 6 (Data Set Ready) to the Super Serial Card and also supplies voltage to lead 8 (Data Carrier Detect) to the Super Serial Card. To correct the hanging problem, cut the pin 6 wire (blue) and the pin 8 wire (black) between the 10 pin connector on the Super Serial Card and the 25 pin DB25 connector on the RS232 interface. These leads are not necessary for the application.

ERROR 8's with the Corvus using Quicktrieve

The persistant ERROR 8's that occur when initializing, reading, or writing to a Corvus volume is caused if the Corvus volume was Apple Docked initialized [5.1] with Quicktrieve. To avoid the ERROR 8:

- 1) Boot your apple from the Corvus (Corvus DOS)
- 2) BRUN DISK,S4,D1 followed by a carriage return.
(where S4 assumes that your floppy drive is in slot #4, for example. It is assumed that Curvus initialization must have been done under CORVUS DOS, not Quicktrieve.)
- 3) The CSI Copyright label should appear. Please proceed with the data collection and distribution. The ERROR 8 should no longer occur.

ERROR REPORT

The following list of errors were reported by customers or found by CSI after the data was first released. They may or may not affect a user depending upon the time the users data was accessed. Some of the errors represent corrections to past data that may only affect expired contracts, and some of the errors may be reported here a second time. The emphasized values, (those in darker print) represent the corrected values.

The base contract causing the error is underlined. Most errors were contributed by the exchange's failure to report timely settlement prices. In this event CSI released the last price traded for the day.

All Chicago Board of Trade volume and open interest was delayed on 4/15/83. The many entries are shown for the early access customer who may have inadvertently collected a repeat of the day before's data.
